Important Academic Dates and Deadlines

This information only applies to students completing **ALL** required coursework for their program and students eligible to graduate in Spring 2022. The dates and deadlines listed below are to keep you on track for degree completion and graduation this semester.

Spring 2022 Masters/EDS Deadlines

- May 11 Final Exam Defense (Submit request 2 weeks prior to defense date)
- May 27 Electronic Thesis/Dissertation

Non-Thesis ONLY Programs (MNR, MIT, MBA, MEng...)

May 16 Non-Thesis Final Exam/Evaluation

Each respective program will send out an email with detailed instructions for Final Exam/Evaluation scheduling towards the end of the semester to ensure you are on track for degree completion and exam scheduling.

Important: An approved Plan of Study is required to Apply for Degree Conferral and to Schedule your Final Exam! You can check to see if you have an approved Plan of Study in Hokie Spa. If **you**

do not have an approved Plan of Study, please reach out to your department for assistance! Your department will work to complete your Plan of Study and ensure that it is received with the Graduate School for Final Approval. <u>Link to Schedule Final Exam</u>

All students graduating are required to have a Final Exam scheduled with the Graduate School for degree awarding.

News About the Northern Virginia Center

The future plans for academic programs at the Northern Virginia Center were announced this week after a vote by the VT Board of Visitors. The NVC will be closing its doors by the end of 2024. Classes will continue at the NVC until that time. Provost Cyril Clarke and Deans Aimée Surprenant, Julie Ross, and Laura Belmonte visited the campus to relate the news to the faculty and staff. Eligible F-1 students may apply for Co-Op/CPT by completing the following at least 30 days before the internship's start date in **Summer 2022**:



Step 1: Apply for Co-Op with <u>the graduate school</u>. The CPT course (GRAD 5944 or 7944) is a 1 credit course that should be added to you POS for the Summer 22 term **before** submitting this step.

Step 2: After grad school approval, <u>apply for CPT</u> with an immigration advisor using IntlHokies > F-1 Curricular Practical Training > **CPT request.**

Hokie Wellness: MoneySmarts U



Escape to a Park!



River Bend Park, Fairfax County, VA River Bend Park is tucked away off of a curvy two-lane road. Entrance is free and you can park at the Visitor's Center. There is a beautiful hike along the Potomac River from the Visitor's Center to the Great Falls Park Visitors Center (the two parks adjoin each other). After you park to the right of the Visitor's Center, go to the end of the parking lot and follow the trail. It's an easy 3-mile hike there and back, with a little challenge of some rock climbing

beside the smaller falls. Take a few moments to look across and above the Potomac from time to time; you may see the Bald Eagles that are nesting across the river. In addition to the eagles, look for the other big birds that inhabit the Potomac; the majestic Grey Blue Heron, the Red-Tailed Hawk and the Turkey Vulture. And ponder at the immense beauty and force of the river at Great Falls Overlook.

There are a lot of other trails that are fun to walk as well. The trail to the left of the Visitor's Center (going west) follows the river to the bend, hence the park's name. If you take the path to the left



(about half way along this trail) it will lead you into the forest and come out at the River Bend Nature Center.



This is a popular park so if you haven't started yet, always bring masks to throw on when passing people.
